Unicycle nationals comes to Madison

Unicycle riders, beginners to expert, from across North America will prove there are limitless ways to ride a unicycle at the 2011 North American Unicycle Convention and Championships (NAUCC). More than 200 unicyclists from as far away as Puerto Rico will participate in opening weekend competitions and activities taking place at the Goodman Center. The event runs July 23 through 30 in Madison and surrounding areas.

“People here are in for a real treat,” says Ann O’Brien, president of the Madison Unicyclists, who are organizing and hosting the event this year. “From unicycle basketball to the remarkable stunts of trials and creative artistic events, there’s nothing else like nationals anywhere.”

Unicycling Society of America (USA) describes the gathering as “all-inclusive and eye-opening.” You can’t imagine how many different ways people can demonstrate technical ability and skills on a unicycle.

The Madison Unicyclists – an all-ages, all-abilities unicycle club that calls the Goodman Center home – is responsible for bringing this event, the largest annual gathering of unicyclists sponsored by USA, to Madison. Competition is open to all who want to unicycle for fun, achieve personal goals or compete for a 2011 National Championship title.

Activities include distance, track and road races, fun rides, mountain unicycling, and artistic and freestyle riding where unicyclists demonstrate skills set to music with props and costumes. Track and field competition involves almost anything you’d find at a conventional track meet such as sprints, high jump and long jump. In trials, street and flatland, riders demonstrate flip tricks and spins, and jumping

over seemingly impossible obstacles. In addition, teams play basketball and hockey.

Workshops will offer information for NAUCC first-timers, how to ride, build a trials course, wheel walking, ballroom dancing, unicycle skills, riding a giraffe and competition judging. There’s even a session on how to start a unicycle physical education program.

The official opening event fun parade will start at 1 pm, July 23 at the Goodman Community Center, and proceed eight blocks to Yahara Place for a criterium race scheduled for 2 pm. Later that afternoon, the flatland competition will be held back at the Goodman Community Center and the trials course will be open for practice and spectators.
